

THOMAS CARROLL cello NICOLA EIMER piano

Admired for his inspirational performances and profound musicianship, **Thomas Carroll** enjoys a distinguished and varied career as a cellist and conductor. As a solo cellist he is in great demand with major orchestras in Britain and abroad and has recorded extensively for numerous labels, giving many world premieres. He is professor of cello at the Royal College of Music and the Yehudi Menuhin School of Music.

Nicola Eimer has performed as a soloist and chamber musician across Europe and America. She has given concerto performances and recitals at St John's Smith Square, the Barbican and the Wigmore Hall, and has made several recordings of works by notable British composers. Nicola is an Associate of the Royal Academy of Music, where she now teaches piano and chamber music.

Their programme begins with the eloquence, wit and charmingly piquant harmonies of Stravinsky's ballet *Pulcinella* as arranged under the title Suite Italienne. Schumann's ravishing Adagio and Allegro is followed by the third, and most expansive, of Beethoven's five cello sonatas, described by the cellist Steven Isserlis as 'one of the most positive works imaginable'. From the opening phrase, he says, 'it radiates serenity, humour and joy'.

TRIO ARISONTO

The acclaimed **Trio Arisonto** is a London-based horn trio made up of the prizewinning young musicians violinist **Ezo Sarici**, horn player **Annemarie Federle** (principal horn of both the London Philharmonic and Aurora Orchestras and a previous BBC Musician prizewinner) and pianist **Harry Rylance**, the members of which met during their studies at the Royal Academy of Music. They are winners of the 2023 Music Club Awards Scheme of the Tunnell Trust.

The core repertory for horn trio may be limited, but in addition to the standard works – including the gloriously lyrical Brahms trio which they offer here – they are dedicated to expanding that repertory. To that end they have premiered several of their own arrangements including, most

recently, that of Wagner's *Tannhäuser* Overture, an unforgettable *tour de force*.

The Three Romances were among the last pieces Clara Schumann wrote before she was obliged to concentrate on her performing career after the hospitalisation and death of her husband, Robert. A gift for her friend the virtuoso violinist Joseph Joachim, these are intimate, deeply touching pieces, their melancholy hues exquisitely captured in this arrangement for horn trio.

RYAN CORBETT accordion

BBC New Generation artist, Royal Over-Seas League Gold medallist and Classic FM Rising Star, **Ryan Corbett** is an accordionist hailed by Sir James MacMillan as 'one of the most astonishing and surprising newcomers in Scottish music'. A leading exponent of his instrument, he has given over eight hours of radio broadcasts and a televised performance at the Scottish coronation of HM King Charles III. He has enlarged the repertoire by creating hundreds of new arrangements for accordion.

Recent seasons have seen recitals across Europe at venues including the Berlin Philharmonie, and he has also performed in the USA, Mexico and China. In the UK, he makes regular appearances at major festivals from Bath to Buxton and Lichfield to Lammermuir. He made his debut at London's Wigmore Hall this year.

In this recital Ryan plays a mixture of pieces written specially for the accordion and arrangements made for the instrument. The magisterial Chaconne from Bach's Partita No. 2 in D minor is heard in Ferruccio Busoni's virtuoso keyboard transcription, while a group of sonatas by

Domenico Scarlatti has been arranged by the player himself.

Václav Trojan's haunting *The Ruined Cathedral* is a poignant meditation on the ruins of Dresden in the Second World War.
The programme ends with Vladislav
Zolotaryov's dazzling Rondo Capriccioso, a remarkable showpiece reinvention of a classical genre.

KEGELSTATT TRIO

Three of the UK's leading orchestral and chamber musicians – **Timothy Orpen**, **Fiona Winning** and **John Reid** – join forces to celebrate the rich and varied sounds of the clarinet, viola and piano trio. The concert opens with Mozart's light-hearted, jovial **Kegelstatt Trio** – named after the skittle alley in which it was supposed to have been written, and after which the ensemble is named – and ends with Schumann's popular *Fairy Tales*. Rebecca Clarke's impressionistic *Morpheus*, for viola and piano, modelled on

Debussy and Vaughan Williams, and Jörg Widmann's extraordinary Fantasie – which 'contains everything I love about the clarinet', the composer has said – complete the programme.
